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Message from the President of the Board of Directors



The past year saw the board review, update and implement a new strategic plan. One of the themes of the new plan places an emphasis upon extending our efforts to strengthen Touchstones Nelson's relationships with its community partners and stakeholders. We are endeavouring to reach out to those entities.

One of the plans currently being implemented is to create sub-collections that will contain items pertaining specifically to each of Areas E, F and H. Another is to increase communication with our partners to keep them better informed of our needs and accomplishments.

The issue of relocation of the collection stored at 402 Anderson remains unresolved. Funding

remains a challenge but some opportunities may be emerging that the board is eager to pursue. 2016 marks Touchstones Nelson's 60th anniversary for which we intend to mount a campaign to pursue this goal. Similarly 2017 is Canada's 150th anniversary. We are hopeful that the federal government will use that opportunity to further the cause of our history as a nation and will provide capital to assist museums in furthering their goals.

The efforts of Touchstones Nelson, and in particular our Executive Director, with respect to our programming and social impact foresight have been recognized by other Canadian museum societies. Leah has been invited to speak at meetings of the Ontario and Alberta Museum Associations on the topic of socially responsible museums which are a result of her addresses on various occasions to the BC Museum Association on that topic. The questions she has fielded on those occasions have indicated keen interest from the participants with respect to Touchstones Nelson's forward thinking and activities.

I and the entire board are very proud of her and our staff for the terrific work they do for Touchstones Nelson and look forward to working with them in the coming year. We are aware of a further accolade that will be awarded to Touchstones Nelson in the near future about which you will learn in the coming weeks.

Message from the Executive Director



find it very gratifying to know that every year at Touchstones Nelson brings with it new challenges, new successes and new approaches to delivering cultural services. This past year was no exception!

In 2014, the board and staff consolidated much of its energy into a control of holdings project that, over the next three years, will see the entirety of our current knowledge about the art and artifact collections entered into a new and very powerful database system - PastPerfect. Purchased through the support of several grants and generous donors, PastPerfect enables researchers, including staff and the public, to access the collections online. Not only will the collection be viewable at any time by any one, the information associated with the collection will become, in a manner of speaking, open source. We hope that the public will engage with us in improving our knowledge of collection items who used these objects, when were they used, even why they were used. Because PastPerfect allows for a two-way exchange of information, the Society is now situated at the exciting intersection of culture, data and technology.

Supporting the control of holdings project is the Society's new Strategic Plan for 2015-2017. Developed by the board in the summer of 2014 and focused on four primary outcomes, the new plan is compact, direct and decisive. For staff, the plan supports the continuation of the control of holdings project (Outcomes 1 and 2), and provides the basis for budget/ grant focus on a lobby renovation to expand the usable space for community gatherings and a flexshop approach (Outcome 3), plus a review of current communications efforts (Outcome 4).

Other Touchstones Nelson milestones in 2014 included the first staff turnover in three years with the departure of Alex Dudley, the Visitor Services Manager, and hiring of Cindy Fillion - who has proven to be a fantastic new member of the team. In 2014, individual donations exceeded our private fundraising efforts for the first time. Hopefully this is an early indication that our efforts to focus on relationship building are succeeding and that we continue to earn and keep your trust. Our sincere thanks goes out to all our donors, sponsors, operating funders and Society members for your support. Thank You!

Archives & Collections – by Laura Fortier

Touchstones Nelson Collection

The collection took in artifacts from twenty-two donors. Highlights included items from the Nelson Chinese Masonic Lodge, a wooden lacrosse stick, and two Doukhobor flax combs. The Chinese Masonic Lodge or *Chee Kong Tong Society*, originally located at 521 Lake Street in what was Nelson's Chinatown, items were stored above King's Restaurant and donated to the Society before its closure. The lacrosse stick was originally from the Nelson Lacrosse Team. Their equipment was given to Trafalgar School after they disbanded. The Doukhobor flax combs were discovered in the attic of a log cabin in Passmore. They are believed to be from the early 1900s. The Society also purchased PastPerfect museum software and completed the first phase of its Control of Holdings Project. The new database marks a significant step forward in stewarding the collections. Staff will have virtual access to the art, artifact and archival collections for research, cataloguing and exhibition purposes reducing the need to remove material from storage.

Shawn Lamb Archives

n 2014, the Shawn Lamb Archives completed a digitization project involving over 150 glassplate negatives from the Society's collection. The Archives also received archival material from twenty seven donors and transfers of materials from two different institutions, Red Deer and District Archives and Kootenay Lake Historical Society. Staff and volunteers replied to over 120 research requests - 14% of which were genealogy related. We created six in-house displays and one off-site display at the Nelson Public Library, as well as loaning items for display to the Nelson Public Library and the Kokanee Glacier Park Visitor Centre. We also added twelve items to our ever growing research library.

Special Projects

Columbia River Treaty Exhibition and Launch

Roll On Columbia explores the legacy of the current Columbia River Treaty in order to inform present day understanding of the trans-boundary Columbia River watershed ecosystem. With funding provided by the Columbia Basin Trust, Touchstones Nelson worked with two guest curators (Eileen Delehanty Pearkes and Deborah Thompson), six artists and one musical group to develop both a visual arts exhibition (paintings, sculpture, textiles, installation, performance) and a travelling history exhibit on the legacy of the current treaty.

Roll On Columbia was presented in Spokane, WA, at the *Columbia River Basin 2014 Conference: Learning From Our Past to Shape Our Future.* Attended by 320 delegates from both sides of the Canada/USA border, the conference offered a timely platform to discuss the future of the Columbia River within the context of a new treaty to be negotiated between Canada and the USA over the next ten years.

Roll On Columbia was nominated for a Canadian Museums Association Award of Outstanding Achievement in Exhibitions (winner announced April 2015). *Roll On Columbia* will be presented at Touchstones Nelson in late 2015.



Special Projects



Discovered: the Kootenay Outlet Collection

n October 25th, 2014 Touchstones Nelson launched its newest online exhibit Discovered: the Kootenay Outlet Collection. This exhibit features over 150 glass plate negatives of the Kootenay Lake Outlet area, including Nelson, Ainsworth and Kaslo; the Prairies; and even Europe. The photos document Kootenay Outlet area homes, businesses, farming and logging industries, school and community events, landscapes, social groups and families. photographic records These capture an area developing into a residential and agricultural centre at the time of growth in the fruit industry in the West Kootenay region. As a collection they fill an important gap in documenting the history of Nelson and area. The creation of the site was funded in part by the Irving K. Barber Learning Centre, University of British Columbia, British Columbia History Digitization Program. The exhibit is available at http://touchstonesnelson.ca/ exhibitions/discovered/.

Kujundzic Catalogue

n recent years, Touchstones Nelson has made the switch from printed exhibition catalogues to the development of e-catalogues. Although the digital version is less expensive to produce, printed catalogues are easier to distribute and are a more tangible legacy of exhibitions that have wide audience appeal. Such was the case with the Zeljko Kujundzic exhibition developed by curator Jessica Demers in the summer of 2014. Both Selkirk College and Touchstones Nelson will distribute the catalogues in the community.



Artifact Loan Kits

n 2014, funding provided by the Osprey Community Foundation supported the development of an artifact loan kit for elementary schools. The Kit contains artifacts and archival materials selected from the now closed Central School Resource Centre along with lesson plans and links to the permanent museum exhibit at Touchstones Nelson. The Kit is now its final testing stage and will be available to schools beginning in September 2015.

The Shop – by Cindy Fillion

2014 saw a change in staff, with Alex Dudley leaving the position of Visitor Services Manager after serving in the position for eight years. Cindy Fillion, who covered Alex's maternity leave in 2010-11, filled the position and is thrilled to be back.

The Shop hosted several events in 2014, including ArtWalk, showcasing Lainey Benson's brilliantly coloured local scenes. Lainey has stayed on at the Shop and is joined by several other painters as well as over 100 local authors and artists. We once again participated in the Baker St. market promoting Touchstones Nelson and selling wares. The Shop hosted several book launches including Larry Jacobsen's *Walhachin: Birth of a Legend*.

The Shop and Archives partnered up with Cartolina to reproduce a collection of maps from the Shawn Lamb Archives. They are available at both stores and have been a popular item with locals and tourists - history buffs and design lovers. Included are the first topography map of the region from 1896, Keen's mining map of 1892, and the Insurance Plan map of Nelson from 1899.

At Christmas time, the Shop hosted a pop-up shop for a weekend. The lobby was packed to the rafters with even more local, handmade goods - you couldn't fit a toothpick in here! We also offered a discount to members for a donation to the St. Saviours' Food Pantry. The Christmas market had another successful year - the Shop proudly continues to support local artists and authors to make a living. The member monthly specials continued with members receiving discounts on popular items throughout the year.
